YNYNS LLANDDWYN, ANGLESEY

Starting from the car park at the Newborough Warren Nature Reserve, a woodland habitat for sand-based species and red squirrels, this walk takes forest tracks and a path across the beach to reach the island of Llanddwyn, a tidal island named after St Dwynwen. After passing the conical white lighthouse built in 1873, set amid lava rock outcrops, the walk heads back down the island and along Malltraeth Sands, with sight of many seabirds, before returning through the woods to the start.

THE LANGDALE PIKES, CUMBRIA

The Langdale Pikes are two of Lakeland's most easily identified and best-loved peaks, standing on the north side of the scenic Langdale Valley, dominating the skyline. This short but demanding traverse of the Langdale Pikes and Pavey Ark starts from the New Dungeon Ghyll Hotel. It follows Dungeon Ghyll to ascend the summits of Pike of Stickle and Harrison Stickle and over the top of Pavey Ark, followed by a descent past Stickle Tarn, passing the tumbling waterfalls of Stickle Ghyll.

DOCKEY WOOD, HERTFORDSHIRE

Woodland carpeted by vibrant bluebells is a beautiful sight in spring on this lovely short walk in the 2,000-hectare Ashridge Estate in the Chiltern Hills, which can be enjoyed in all seasons. There is an extensive network of paths and tracks through the estate. This walk starts at the Bridgewater Monument, which is a splendid viewpoint, with a gentle amble through the woods to reach the path along the top of the steep scarp slope overlooking the picturesque village of Aldbury below.

PENNINE WAY, NORTHUMBERLAND

Built by the Romans under Emperor Hadrian in AD 122, Hadrian's Wall follows the undulating natural landscape for 73 miles (117km). Starting from the car park at Steel Rigg, this walk along a section of the famous Pennine Way climbs sharply up onto the crags from where there are superb views. It eventually descends to leave the Wall and reach the edge of Wark Forest. After easy walking along farm tracks with views towards Hadrian's Wall across Greenlee Lough, it returns to the start.

CAMBRIDGE - THE BACKS, CAMBRIDGESHIRE

This fascinating walk starting from Parker's Piece is filled with interest, passing University buildings and The Backs of the colleges with their manicured lawns leading down to the River Cam. It follows a footpath along a stream and roads to Trumpington and on to the quaint village of Grantchester with its famous Old Vicarage. The return is through watermeadows alongside the Cam, passing The Backs and viewing the fronts of many colleges, historic churches and the Fitzwilliam Museum.

WHEAL COATES, CORNWALL

Starting from the car park at the little cove of Chapel Porth, this wonderful walk follows the South West Coast Path towards St Agnes, with stunning views. It passes the well-preserved ruins of the Wheal Coates engine house, built in 1872. The tin mine's shaft sank 146m with tunnels out under the sea. At Trevaunance Cove a path leads into St Agnes, then climbs to the summit of St Agnes Beacon, offering superb panoramas, before descending via a meandering footpath back to Chapel Porth.



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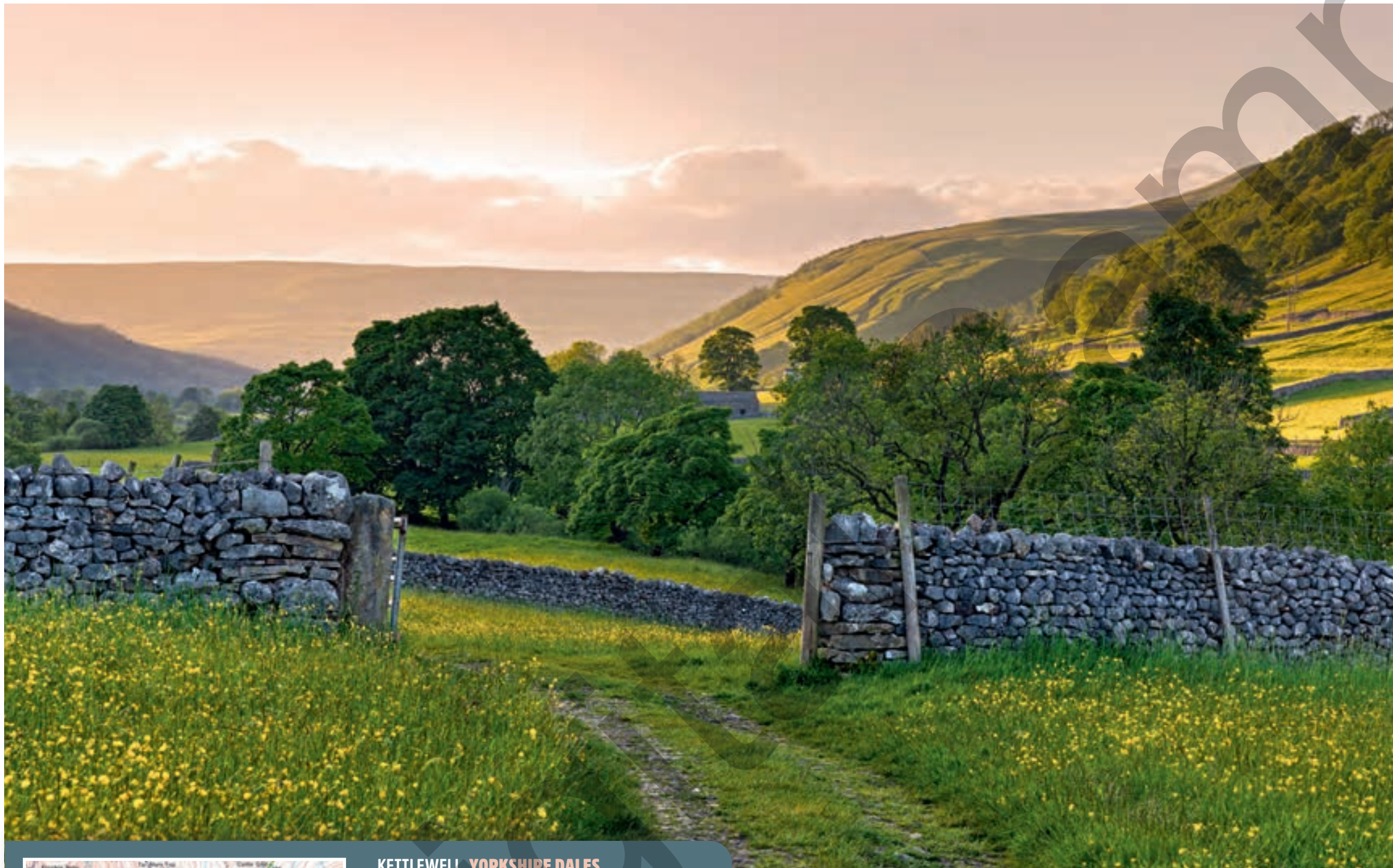

KETTLEWELL, YORKSHIRE DALES

This walk starts from Kettlewell, a 13th century market town and a lead mining centre in the 18th to 19th centuries. Its three ancient inns were former stagecoach stops. It follows the Dales Way along the River Wharfe and climbs gradually on an old pack-horse route, then ascends steeply to the summit of Great Whernside (704m). With its gritstone cap over a limestone base, it is one of the finest and highest peaks of the Yorkshire Dales. The walk descends via footpaths to Kettlewell.

STOB DEARG PEAK, HIGHLAND

Stob Dearg (the 'Red Peak') is one of the summits of Buachaille Etive Mòr (1,021m), the iconic, rugged pyramid-shaped mountain at the entrance to Glen Coe. Starting from Altnaíeachd on the A82, it involves a challenging climb through the defences of the NE face, Curved Ridge, classed as an easy rock climb or a hard scramble, but only for experienced rock climbers. The descent route is much easier and is a popular and well-used alternative for walkers going up Buachaille Etive Mòr.

SEVEN SISTERS, EAST SUSSEX

Starting from the charming village of Alfriston, passing the half-timbered 14th century Old Clergy House, restored by the National Trust, this bracing walk climbs onto the Sussex Downs with splendid panoramic views. It descends to sea-level to join the South Downs Way at Cuckmere Haven and the dramatic Seven Sisters cliffs, then follows the river from its estuary, diverting through the Seven Sisters Country Park and Friston Forest to rejoin the river in a gentle return to Alfriston.

GOLDEN CAP, DORSET

This walk follows the South West Coast Path and inland paths and lanes across undulating open farmland. It takes in a section of the spectacular Jurassic Coast, climbing to the top of Golden Cap, the iconic 191m hill whose name derives from the distinctive golden greensand rock at the top. The base of the cliff is covered with big boulders and is popular with fossil collectors. The start and finish are the NT Stonebarrow Hill car park with the village of Seatown as the halfway point.

MAM TOR, DERBYSHIRE

Mam Tor is called the 'Shivering Mountain' as its horizontal layers of shale and gritstone are constantly being eroded, causing landslips. This walk climbs from Castleton village, past Peak, Speedwell and Treak Cliff Caverns to the base of Mam Tor and the Blue John Mine. A steep path leads to the summit of Mam Tor, with fine views of the Castleton and Edale valley and the Kinder plateau. The path follows the 3km ridge to Lose Hill, descending to the valley below and back to Castleton.

CASTLE COMBE, WILTSHIRE

This walk starts in the picturesque village of Castle Combe, viewed here on a snowy day. The village of mellow stone houses lies in a deep hollow leading down to the river. The walk crosses a golf course, then follows paths and lanes to the large Lughbury Long Barrow. After passing through the hamlets of Nettleton and West Kington with its church, it returns over fields to an old stone footbridge. A track through woodland and a road lead to the wood above Castle Combe and the finish.
